

ABOUT THE BOOK

Recent high-school graduate Chelsea is determined to escape her alcoholic mother and take her beloved younger sister, Mariah, with her. After Chelsea's high-school graduation, the girls spend summer in a seaside town with their no-nonsense Aunt Bobbie. As Chelsea makes clumsy forays into adulthood, Mariah grows increasingly close with a warm and nurturing married couple — a pair of artists who eventually reveal themselves to be predators. This coming-of-age summer proves deeply traumatic for both sisters.

When the FBI knocks on Chelsea's door fifteen years later, it's because her sister has joined a cult responsible for violent crimes. It's evident that Mariah is now in serious danger. Chelsea must revisit and dissect all the painful, messy details of that long-ago summer. Understanding Mariah's choices may be Chelsea's only chance to help extract her sister from the cult — before its elusive leader, Agape, persuades Mariah to take actions that will drive the sisters permanently apart.
